

Egyptian Maths with King Khasekhem

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
This is a statue of Khasekem, one of the first Kings of Egypt. He is wearing the crown of Upper Egypt and sitting on a throne. Around the base of the statues there are engraved pictures of Khasekem's slaughtered enemies. Perhaps he wanted people to remember how many people his armies killed for him to become King!
